What is Care Coordination?

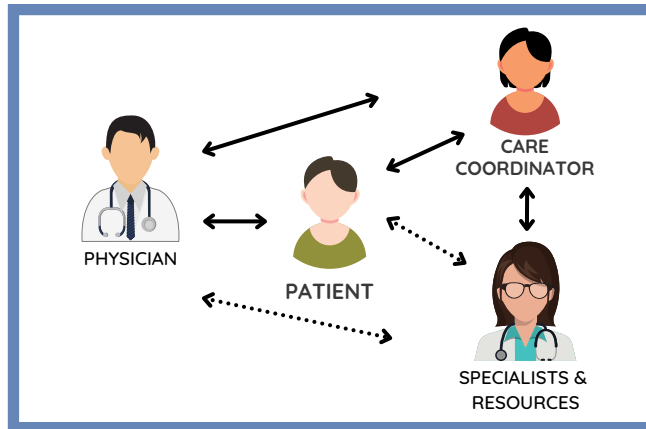
Care coordination is a patient-centered approach that involves working with the patient and family, primary care physician, specialists, and other members of the care team. Our goal is to create a support system that ensures the patient has the resources and tools to improve their health and quality of life. It involves organization of healthcare activities and collaboration between different healthcare providers to bridge the gaps between silos of care.



How Can Care Coordinators Help My Patients?

Care coordinators work directly with the patient to identify their areas of concern, develop a care plan to achieve their health goals, and provide education about different healthcare services.

Care coordinators work with other care team members to facilitate the delivery of services, address barriers to accessing care, and connect the patient with healthcare specialists and community resources.



Who is Eligible to Receive Services?

Currently, IHH provides care coordination services for physicians and their patients needing extra support in their health journey. IHH can help to connect patients with timely access to medical and behavioral healthcare, social services, educational services, and various community resources.
